Saint Mary's University of Minnesota is dedicated to advancing the educational and career goals of today's students. Founded in 1912, Saint Mary's is a private, Catholic, comprehensive institution, guided by the De La Salle Christian Brothers since 1933.

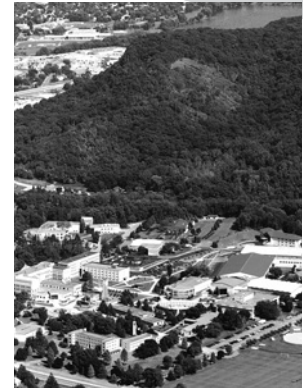
Enriched by the Lasallian Catholic heritage, Saint Mary's University of Minnesota awakens, nurtures, and empowers learners to ethical lives of service and leadership.

Special Recognition

"U.S. News & World Report" ranks Saint Mary's in its "National Universities" category. Saint Mary's is one of a select group of U.S. institutions honored by the John Templeton Foundation for "consciously instilling integrity and value judgment into the educational experience of students." Saint Mary's is also listed in the "Colleges of Distinction" national guidebook that honors select institutions for excelling in key areas of educational quality.

Saint Mary's offers undergraduate, graduate and certificate programs at locations in Minnesota, Wisconsin and Nairobi, Kenya. The nearly 5,700 students include 1,400 traditional undergraduates at Winona, with approximately 4,300 adult learners in the Schools of Graduate and Professional Programs.

At the **coeducational, residential Winona campus**, the undergraduate college curriculum combines traditional liberal arts and sciences with career preparation in a student-centered environment. The Winona campus comprises 400 acres and 47 buildings, with excellent facilities for living, learning and recreation. A 14km skiing and running trail, trout stream and disc golf course wind through the campus bluffs and valleys. A ropes course is being constructed next to a new track and soccer complex.



Academic programs include 57 undergraduate majors with a student-to-faculty ratio of 12:1. The vibrant campus community offers a full spectrum of student organizations and activities, and 21 NCAA Division III athletic teams. Paintball, lacrosse, rugby, water polo, men's volleyball, dance team, scuba, and skiing/snowboarding are club sports.

Saint Mary's Schools of Graduate and Professional Programs is one of the largest graduate schools in Minnesota. A pioneer in outreach education since 1984, the school offers pre-bachelor, bachelor degree completion, certificate, master degree, and post-master and doctoral programs.
