# ARTICULATION GUIDELINES

**Saint Mary's University**  
January 2007

Saint Mary's University is a Catholic, coeducational, liberal arts university administered by the De La Salle Christian Brothers. Our undergraduate campus is located in Winona, MN, a college town of 26,000 residents. Winona is 120 miles south of the Twin Cities and approximately 300 miles from the Chicagoland area. 1,300 undergraduate students attend SMU. 92% of those students live on the 400-acre campus in 15 residence halls.

## **Transfer of Credits**

All college-level course credits comparable to Saint Mary's offerings (100 level or higher) will transfer as long as the student receives at least a "C" grade in the course. Courses listed on this guide will meet Saint Mary's University general education requirements. Students need a minimum 2.0/4.0 college GPA to be considered for transfer to SMU. Saint Mary's University will accept the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum for students who have earned at least a "C" or higher in each course within that curriculum. In addition, students must complete the following requirements of the SMU general education program: 2 Faith Traditions courses to fulfill the Content Areas portion and the junior/senior sequence of the Lasalian Core Traditions Program. CLEP and Advanced Placement credits are accepted. Scores must be submitted to the Registrar's Office for evaluation. Saint Mary's also offers a Credit for Life Experience program for non-traditional students.

## **Application Procedures**

Students must submit an application for admission (hard copy or online). Upon acceptance, students will receive an official transcript evaluation of all college courses, outlining which courses will satisfy Saint Mary's general education requirements and the total number of credits accepted for transfer.

## **Academic Calendar**

Saint Mary's operates on a semester schedule with classes beginning in August and January. Students can apply to enter Saint Mary's for either semester.

## **Graduation Requirements**

122 semester credits are needed to graduate. 60 semester hours in residence are required for graduation.
